

Liberation of Guipavas

Sue and Rick were delighted and honoured to accept an invitation represent to the **Twinning** Association and Callington Town Council respectively at the 70th anniversary of liberation of the



Guipavas. The weekend was action-packed and, in all, both very moving and emotional.

Two American families represented GIs who were involved in the liberation and excerpts from the day journal of one of them were read out by his son and highlighted the dramatic events as they had unfurled



in 1944 and the way in which he had been cared for by a Guipavas family, having parachuted from a damaged airplane, until his repatriation. In commemoration of that event there is now a *Rue Robert Chapman* in Guipavas, named in his memory. It was certainly a deeply felt gesture by both French and American participants.

The liberation was marked in a number of ways: wreaths were laid at the war memorial in the town



centre, peace poems in French, English and German were read out by French schoolchildren and messages of peace from students in Guipavas, Callington

and Barsbüttel were attached to a Freedom Tree as a sign of the huge progress that has been made in terms of European understanding since the end of World War II.

Strange to see were the French re-enactors who appeared in a variety of roles: a host of troops who had been under the leadership of General Patton - plain Gls, sergeants, five-star generals (complete

with cigar and dark glasses!), motorcycle outriders, members of the French resistance and girls dressed in fashions from the era.



In the procession were Willys jeeps, a Sherman tank, half-tracks and French cars of the time, notably the *Citroën Traction Avant*. These all congregated at *Ie Vergez* on the outskirts of Guipavas at a site where a reconstruction of the original American camp in 1944 had been built. With an exhibition of memorabilia, demonstrations of Morse code, a field hospital, a re-enactment of an attack on a foxhole and even demonstrations of the dances of the 40s this meant the site was buzzing for the duration of the two-day event. A most memorable experience!
